


- 
1. Do outreach to press outlets of electronic and print media, with a statement or press releases on your activity in support of the White House Conference on Children and Youth
  2. Link your website to the CWLA White House Conference Website:

  3. Join with others in getting your state legislators to adopt a resolution calling for a White House Conference on Children and Youth
  4. Get the Mayor or the city/county council to pass a resolution in support of the White House Conference on Children and Youth and send a copy to the White House and CWLA
  5. Call or meet with your Governor and ask him/her to call on the President to hold a White House Conference on Children and Youth
  6. Utilize social networking sites like Facebook to support and promote the White House Conference on Children and Youth "Cause"
  7. Write a letter to the editor and get others to do the same, calling for a White House Conference on Children and Youth
  8. Attend a Congressional/Senate Town Meeting while your member is in the district during the Spring Break (March 29-April 12). Ask them to cosponsor legislation to re-establish a White House Conference on Children and Youth
  9. Network with other state and local groups or organizations in support of a White House Conference on Children and Youth, including:
    - Local agencies
    - Boards of organizations
    - Youth
    - College students
    - Foster youth/alumni
    - Foster parents
    - Kinship families
    - Doctors/pediatricians
    - Social workers
    - Therapists
    - Teachers
    - PTA's
    - Legal advocates
    - Special needs advocates
