### In Delaware...

- There are 13,726 children living in grandparent-headed households (7.1% of all children in the state). There are another 3,743 children living in households headed by other relatives (1.9 % of all children in the state). Of the children living in households headed by grandparents or other relatives in Delaware, 7,803 are living there without either parent present.
- 
- 7,204 grandparents report they are responsible for their grandchildren living with them: 40% of these grandparents are African American; 6% are Hispanic/Latino; and 52% are White. 38% of these grandparents live in households without the children's parents present. 73% are under the age of 60; 13.8% live in poverty.

## Children in Foster Care

### Numbers – July 2006

- 810 children in out-of-home placements under the supervision of the Delaware Department of Services for Children, Youth and Their Families.
- 74 of these children were placed with relatives. Of the 80 relative providers, one is a Foster Care Approved Relative.

### Preferences

- State policy requires that kin be considered first for out-of-home placements.
- There is no separate licensing program for kinship foster parents.
- Kin must meet the same licensing standards and requirements and receive the same foster care payment rate as non-kin foster parents.
- Any person applying to become a foster parent must complete 27 hours of pre-service training. Additional parent training required each year.

- Delaware does not currently have a subsidized guardianship program but continues to support families who participated in the federally-funded subsidized guardianship demonstration project.

## State Law

Laws change and are subject to different interpretations. These general descriptions are not intended as legal advice in any particular situation.

## Medical Consent

Del. Code Ann. Tit. 13 § 707

- Allows parents to sign a consent form authorizing grandparent or relative caregiver to consent to medical care on behalf of a child. Relative caregiver must have a notarized *Caregivers Medical Authorization* affidavit.

## Educational Consent

Del. Code Ann. 14, § 202

- Allows a child who resides with anyone other than the parents to be enrolled in a school district based on the residence of the child’s guardian with a proper *Caregivers School Authorization* affidavit.

## Guardianship and Permanent Guardianship

Del. Code Ann. Tit. 13§ 23

- Provides a framework for filing, granting and modifying guardianships in Family Court; creates new legal status of permanent guardian, assuring permanency for older foster children for whom adoption is not possible or appropriate.
